

Phase II GROB Joining Instructions

Congratulations on being selected to conduct your Ph II training on the Grob G120A. These instructions, along with the CFTS General Joining Instructions, are designed to give you information to get you smoothly started. These instructions are specific to Ph II and provide you with information about your upcoming course.

Your Ph II trg will be conducted on the Grob G120A aircraft with your ground and flight instruction provided by KF Aero Instructors. While you are here you will fall under the Commandant, 3 CFFTS for military administration and disciplinary matters.

Your course will consist of 95 training days and is programmed using a 168-day flying training day calendar, which means that in any given year there are only 168 days where flight training activities are possible. This means that you will be in Southport for approximately 6 to 7 months, dependent upon the time of year you arrive. Training received on the Grob G120A mirrors the type of training your compatriots are receiving on the Harvard II so rest assured that both courses will prepare you equally for your Ph III training. Training activities will consist of:

- 19 1/2 days of ground school; and
- 82 flight training events:
 - · 26 Flying Training Device lessons; and
 - 56 Air lessons and solos.

The dress on the first day will be DEU 1A (issued oxfords are the only footwear authorized for DEU 1A). Please ensure that you pay proper military respects to officers outside of the facilities. You are to report to the Hilly Brown Building, no later than 07:50 hrs, on the first day of the course.
